

Professor Kimberley Wade

Kim Wade is a Professor of Psychology at the University of Warwick, UK. She is a cognitive psychologist specializing in autobiographical and episodic memory. Her research examines the impact of social, cognitive, and environmental factors on autobiographical memory distortions. She is best known for her research demonstrating the distorting effects of doctored photos and videos on memory. Much of her work has implications for policymakers and practitioners working in legal and clinical contexts. Kim is the Co-Director of Warwick University's *Centre for Operational Police Research (COPR)* which she founded with colleagues from Warwick's Law School and Business School in 2014. She is the Executive Director of the international *Society for Applied Research in Memory and Cognition (SARMAC)*. Kim has served as an Associate Editor at the journal *Legal and Criminological Psychology* for 8 years and she currently sits on four editorial boards. Kim's research is published in many high-impact journals, and appears frequently in the media, in undergraduate texts, and in books for the educated layperson. She is a Fellow of the *Association for Psychological Science*.
